Termly Overview – Term 2 – 2025/26

Literacy & English

Reading and Spelling – Pupils will develop reading and spelling skills through the Read Write Inc. programme. This term we will complete teaching of the initial sounds and begin to introduce two letter sounds such as sh and ch. We will continue to work on blending our sounds together. See QR code below.

Writing – continue to develop fine-motor skills, letter formation and introduce writing words. We will also look at the components of a sentence.

Phonological awareness will be developed through songs, rhymes and stories.

Talking and listening skills will be taught throughout.

Numeracy & Mathematics

- Continue learning to read, write, count and order numbers up to 5/10/20 and beyond.
- Addition and Subtraction with concrete materials
- Number bonds
- Doubling numbers
- Money (coins to £2)
- Angles, symmetry and transformation (linking with our IDL focus)
- Shape (revise 2D and explore 3D)

Mental maths focus on quick recall of numerical facts such as doubles to 10, numbers before and after and calculations.

Health & Wellbeing

This term we will focus on Team Invasion Games such as basketball and hockey. In December we will focus on social dancing.

We are using Emotion Works to learn about Emotion Words and Emotion Behaviours through stories and other texts.

A whole school focus is to learn about the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC). This term we are particularly focusing on Article 28, 29 and 12. We also have focus weeks which explore Anti-bullying and Road Safety.

Interdisciplinary Learning & Other

Mrs Paton will continue to teach **drama**. This term she will be teaching drama techniques using the UNCRC as a stimulus. She will also continue teaching **French**.

The Youth **Music** Initiative (YMI) will be continue until the end of November. These sessions consist of music-making, ensemble playing, and instrumental learning.

Our **interdisciplinary topic** this term is 'My Street' which will explore our local area by investigating maps, our community, people who help us, local nature and road safety.

Communication & Home Learning

We will continue to share information about school life on Seesaw.

Please see your child's latest literacy and numeracy assessments on Seesaw and help them consolidate their learning at home. The number and sound flashcards sent home in October are a good way to reinforce learning.

We are also happy to communicate over Seesaw message should you have any queries or to share any exciting news, adventures, or creations from home that your child can then show in class.
